RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

APPROVAL AND POINTS

The Wild West Classic is an event combining two separate Regional Championship shows. The PHCBC Regional Championship Show is sponsored by the Peruvian Horse Club of BC and the Wild Rose Regional Championship Show is sponsored by the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta. Each show is approved by the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada and will receive **DOUBLE POINTS** towards PHAC awards. Each show is approved by the North American Peruvian Horse Association for points.

MEMBERSHIP AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

Non-Members of the PHAC are eligible to participate in this event and will not be charged any additional fees. Horses registered or pending with the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada are eligible to be shown. Horses owned by residents of Canada **MUST** be registered or pending with the PHAC. Horses owned by residents of other countries are eligible to be shown provided they are registered or pending with AAOBPPH, PPHRNA or NAPHA. Owners in arrears with PHCBC, PHCA, PHAC or NAPHA will not be allowed to show until arrears are cleared.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The shows are run under PHAC show rules and in any case where this Premium List appears to be in conflict with those rules, the PHAC Rules shall take precedence. Everything possible is being done to conduct this show on the highest possible level for the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators. The best adjudicating officials to be found have been selected and they will place awards on the horses as they see them presented in the ring, without regard to previous records and performances. The PHCBC and PHCA are most desirous of fair treatment for all exhibitors and in return asks for cooperation of all helping to make this show a successful and enjoyable event. Every person who participates in this show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the rules and regulations of:

1. The PHAC By-Laws
2. The PHAC Book of Peruvian Horse Showing 2008
3. The Peruvian Horse Breed Standard and PHAC Code of Ethics

Copies of the above named Rules and Regulations can be obtained at a cost of \$ 5.00 by writing to: The Peruvian Horse Association of Canada, Lyalta, Alberta, T0J 1Y0 or at no cost from the PHAC website (www.phac.ca).

All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class descriptions, descriptions of gear and attire, conduct and ethics, and conditions for this show are described in the above named publications. **ALL EXHIBITORS, HANDLERS AND RIDERS** and other persons participating in the show are responsible for a thorough knowledge of **ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS**.

Displays of poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Anyone with a complaint or protest must file at the show office and arrange for an appointment with the official Show Steward.

RESPONSIBILITY

All entries will be accepted with the understanding that the PHCBC, PHCA, PHAC, NAPHA, members of the show committee and Armstrong-Spallumcheen Parks & Recreation Commission will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that in any way may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Management but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs, that may arise out of any injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of himself or any other person in charge of any such horse. PLEASE ensure that you have sufficient personal insurance coverage to supplement the coverage provided by the show.

SUBSTITUTION OF JUDGES AND OTHER OFFICIALS

In the event that the judge (or other official designated herein) is unable to perform his/her duties due to circumstances beyond his/her control or for any other reason, the Peruvian Horse Club of BC and/or the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta reserve the right to substitute another approved judge (or other official) in his/her place.

JUDGE'S AUTHORITY

The judge shall have the authority to place any horse in whatever position in a class he/she thinks the merit of the horse justifies. The Judge shall award first, second or third place, etc., according to merit, but shall award places starting with first and continuing in order in each class. This applies whether there are one or more entries in a class. If there are more horses of merit in a class than there are prizes offered in that class, the Judge has the right to award honorable mentions. The Judge has the right to make favorable comments over the public address system about the horses shown before him/her, but shall make no negative comments.

DRUGS & FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES

Please be advised that mandatory random drug screening MAY be enforced at this show. There will be a \$5.00 fee to cover the cost of testing (included in ALL-IN-ONE fee). If a horse is randomly chosen, it is escorted to separate area where it must be kept until successful collection of a sample of blood or urine. Please also note:

- a) The exhibitor or his agent is to advise the Show Manager or Secretary in writing of all drugs administered in any fashion within (seventy-two) 72 hours prior to or during the show. This information is to be made available for inspection by anyone interested.
- b) No horse shall be eligible for competition in any class if it has been administered a forbidden substance, i.e. any stimulant, depressant, tranquilizer or local anesthetic which might affect the performance, temperament or courage of the horse. Also prohibited are any drugs which might mask or screen the presence of forbidden substances. Any horse entered in an approved show is subject to examination by the official show veterinarian. Such examinations may include physical, saliva, urine and blood. Refusal to submit a horse for examination and to cooperate with the official show veterinarian and technicians constitutes a violation and subjects the responsible person to penalties.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Horses from the United States will need a CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS report (Coggins test good for 6 months) and an INTERNATIONAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE endorsed by a Federal Veterinarian, showing examination within the 30 days prior to entering Canada. This paperwork can take as long as three weeks so please plan ahead. For further information contact the Canadian Veterinarian at Canada Customs at the border crossing of your choice. Please check for a current schedule to cross without an appointment or to set an appointment.

STALLIONS

For the purposes of showing, stallions 4 and over will be required to have two descended testicles. The only exception being those registered as breeding stallions with the PHAC, AAOBPPH, PPHRNA or NAPHA with one descended testicle for which veterinary certification can be provided showing that the missing testicle was lost due to non-hereditary causes such as illness or injury.

PRUEBA FUNCIONAL

This is **mandatory** for all horses which qualify for a Championship in the breeding, luxury, performance, pleasure and gait divisions (under saddle) in this show. **It will consist of three (3) miles more or less, which must be covered in thirty (30) minutes or less.** The horses must work in gait and must wear a saddle and bridle of any style. The Prueba Funcional is not to be used as a means of disqualifying horses in and of itself. Provided the horse completes the Prueba in the allotted time, the horse will be eligible to enter the championship class where eliminations for unsoundness will take place in the usual manner. The Prueba Funcional will be held on Sunday, June 7th at 7:00 am in the Agriplex arena. **Horses competing in Class 55 for the Performance Championship are strongly encouraged to ride the Prueba Funcional at 7:00 am Sunday morning. A Prueba may be scheduled during Sunday lunch break in the Agriplex arena for those horses qualifying in Class 55 who are not able to participate in the 7:00 am Prueba Funcional.** A list of qualifying horses that must complete the Prueba will be posted outside the show office. If your horse qualifies, please report 15 minutes prior to your allotted time.

<p>PLEASE NOTE: Any bit horse which has qualified for a championship class but has completed four (4) saddle classes for that show will be exempt from the Prueba.</p>

WARM UP RINGS

An outside warm up ring will be available prior to and during the show. On Sunday June 7th, the Armstrong-Enderby Riding Club will be conducting a show in the warm up ring closest to the barns; however, the large outdoor warm up ring in front of the grandstands will be available during that time. **The Agriplex Arena will not be available until noon, Thursday, June 4th.**

STABLING FACILITIES

4 nights are included in "All in One" entry fee including bedding and cleanout. Stall fees for 4 nights will be \$75 for all non-showing or sales horses. Tack rooms are \$75 for 4 nights. Horses must be placed in assigned stalls and **no changes will be permitted except with the consent of the barn manager**. Each animal must have a separate stall (except broodmares with suckling foals). Stalls will be ready for use Thursday, June 4th at noon and must be vacated by Monday, June 8th at 8:00 am (unless additional nights have been paid for). Exhibitors who require additional nights either before or after the show should note on their entry forms and/or contact the barn manager Lynn Moker at lmoker@xplornet.com or (403) 343-2814. Fees for extra days will be \$15/day. Exhibitors arriving prior to Wednesday, June 3rd, 7:00 pm, may be required to bed their horses' stalls.

SECURITY

Security will be patrolling the grounds during the following times: Friday, June 5th 9:00 pm – 5:00 am, Saturday, June 6th 6:00 pm – 4:00 am and Sunday, June 7th 6:00 pm – 4:00 am. **The Show Committee recommends that all vehicles, trailers and tack rooms are locked and personal items in the camping area are secured at all times.**

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A PHOTOCOPY OF THE FRONT AND BACK OF THE HORSE'S REGISTRATION CERTIFICATION. IN THE CASE OF A "PENDING REGISTRATION", INCLUDE A COPY OF THE APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION. EVERY ENTRY FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY THE OWNER OR HIS AUTHORIZED AGENT. IF SIGNED BY AN AGENT, INCLUDE A COPY OF THE AUTHORIZATION.

SHOW ENTRIES MUST BE PAID IN FULL PRIOR TO ENTERING CLASSES. FOR ACCOUNTING PURPOSES, EXHIBITORS MAY NOT LEAVE "BLANK CHEQUES" AT THE SHOW OFFICE OR REQUEST STAKES/PURSE WINNINGS BE DEDUCTED FROM ENTRY FEES.

POST ENTRIES

There will be no post entry fees at this show; however, to help our show secretary, all exhibitors are encouraged to send their entry forms and fees no later than May 15th, 2009. **The Show Office will open Thursday, June 4th at 6:00 pm, and 1 hour before the start of each session, closing 15 minutes before classes start to allow for additions to classes and changes. Please ensure all additions are made before this**

Time even if you are not sure you are going to enter a class, add in that class. Scratches will be taken at the gate by the gate steward.

MEET THE JUDGES – THURSDAY JUNE 4TH AT 8:00 PM

The judges will be introduced to the exhibitors at a meeting on Thursday, June 4th at 8:00 pm in the Agriplex.

GATE RULE

The 3-minute gate rule will be strictly adhered to. Call for classes will be made well in advance, so be at the holding area and **CHECKED IN WITH THE RING ADMISSION STEWARD** before your class is going in the door. When a tack or attire change is required and an entry cannot make the 3-minute ruling, a request for additional time may be approved by the Show Manager or in his absence, the Ring Admission Steward, Show Secretary, or the Show Announcer prior to the start of judging.

NO ENTRY WILL BE PERMITTED INTO THE RING AFTER THE GATE HAS BEEN CLOSED.

LARGER CLASSES

Larger classes may be divided at the discretion of the Ring Master.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded for first through fifth place in every class. Champions of Champions, Best Gait and Best Bozal will receive large traditional neck ribbons. Large, distinctive ribbons will be awarded to Champions and Reserve Champions. Trophies will be awarded to Champions, Champion of Champions, Best Gait, Best Bozal and High Point Winners.

PRIMERISO (NOVICE) DIVISION – Please note rule change effective January 1, 2007.

As of January 1, 2007, a Novice will be defined as a person who on January 1st of the current year, has not won **five first place awards** in classes at shows approved by the PHAC, NAPHA, PPHRNA, or AAOBPPH. (I.E. if a person starts the year as a novice, they will be eligible to show as a novice for the entire calendar year even if they pass the “five-firsts” milestone during the year.) **Please read PHAC Show Rules Rule IX, Part II, Section 6A for the complete rules in this division.** Exhibitors with shod horses will be permitted to participate in this division but cannot participate in any other classes except the Costume Class. A High Point Primeriso trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor that has accumulated the most points in the qualifying classes at this show. . Points will be awarded 1 – 6 (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place, 5 for 2nd place, 4 for 3rd place, 3 for 4th place and 2 for 5th place).

JUNIOR CLASSES

Please note: Effective January 1, 2007, helmets are mandatory for Junior riders in the 12 and under age category. The Junior Division will be split in two age groups (12 years of age & under and 13 years of age & over). At the discretion of the Show Committee, the junior classes may be run simultaneously, however judging and ribbon presentation will remain separated.

HIGH POINT HORSE OF SHOW AWARD

The entry with the highest number of points based on the top five placings in their best classes will be the High Point Horse of Show. Point will be awarded 1 – 6 (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place). Classes which qualify for High Point Horse of Show points are:

Trail Class

English/Western/Australian Performance
Vintage Class
Bozal Performance

JUDGING PROCEDURE: The horses will be judged by both Judges, however the Judges will NOT CONFER but will place the classes individually for the club that each represents. Any requests requiring the consent of the other Judge (such as for a short recess) shall be made through the Ring Steward, who will advise the other Judge and the Announcer.

A. REGULAR CLASSES: A Champion of Champions or Laureado horse will not appear on the Judge's card, for that division, for a club in which it is a past Champion of Champions or Laureado.

B. CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: Horses that qualify in a regular class will be judged in the show in which it qualified.

C. CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CLASSES: Past champions may go directly into the Champion of Champions classes for which they are qualified, along with the champions of the current year. The past National Champions of Champions will also be allowed to enter directly: NAPHA, PPHRNA, AAOBPPH, and PHAC. A Laureado horse will not appear on Judge's card, for that division, for the show in which it is Laureado.

SPECIAL CLASS RULES

CLASS 4 JACK BENNY – This is open to all horses (bit or bozal) ridden by those who are between 39 and 58 years of age by the date of the show. Will be judged as a pleasure class but open to amateurs and professionals.

CLASS 7 ENGLISH/WESTERN/AUSTRALIAN PERFORMANCE – Exhibitors must have appropriate attire for horse and rider. Will be judged as a pleasure class but open to amateurs and professionals.

CLASS 12 CRYSTAL CLASS – Open to all horses in bit 12 years of age and over. Will be judged as a Breeding/Luxury class.

CLASS 14 GELDING STAKES - Entry Fee - \$100. \$500 ADDED TO PURSE FOR EACH SHOW. To be judged as per Luxury Gelding rules and is open only to geldings born in North America. Prize money will be awarded from a percentage of the proceeds from entries and donations, to be divided as follows: 1st - 40%; 2nd - 25%; 3rd - 20%; 4th - 10%; 5th - 5%.

CLASS 16 VINTAGE CLASS - This is open to all horses (bit or bozal) ridden by those who have attained the age of 59 or more by the date of the show. Will be judged as a pleasure class but open to amateurs and professionals.

CLASS 20 PRIMERISO PLEASURE STAKES-Entry Fee \$40. \$300 ADDED TO PURSE FOR EACH SHOW. Open to bit or bozal horses and riders who qualify as per Novice Division rules. Will be judged as a pleasure class. Prize money to be awarded from a percentage of proceeds from entries and donations, to be divided as follows: 1st - 40%; 2nd - 25%; 3rd - 20%; 4th - 10%; 5th - 5%.

CLASS 28 TRAIL CLASS - Open to horses in bit or bozal, amateur or professional rider. The horse and rider must complete a number of obstacles and the winner is determined by number of points attained. **Two refusals and the team must proceed to the next obstacle.** See illustration.

CLASS 39 WILD WEST OWNER TO RIDE PERFORMANCE STAKES - Entry Fee – \$40. \$200 ADDED TO PURSE FOR EACH SHOW - Open to Mares, Stallions and Geldings 4 and over in bit. Will be judged in accordance with Pleasure Division Rules except that professionals are eligible to compete provided that they are the registered owner (or immediate family). To be judged 30% on gait (smoothness 10%, advance 10%, thread 5%, termino 5%), 20% Conformation and Condition, 20% on brio and collection, 30% on manners. Prize money to be awarded from a percentage of proceeds from entries and donations, to be divided as follows: 1st - 40%; 2nd - 25%; 3rd - 20%; 4th - 10%; 5th - 5%.

CLASS 41 COSTUME CLASS – To allow novices with shod horses to participate in this class, the Costume Class will NOT be used to calculate the High Point Horse of the Shows. Each show will award a purse of \$60 for First Place and \$40 for Second Place.

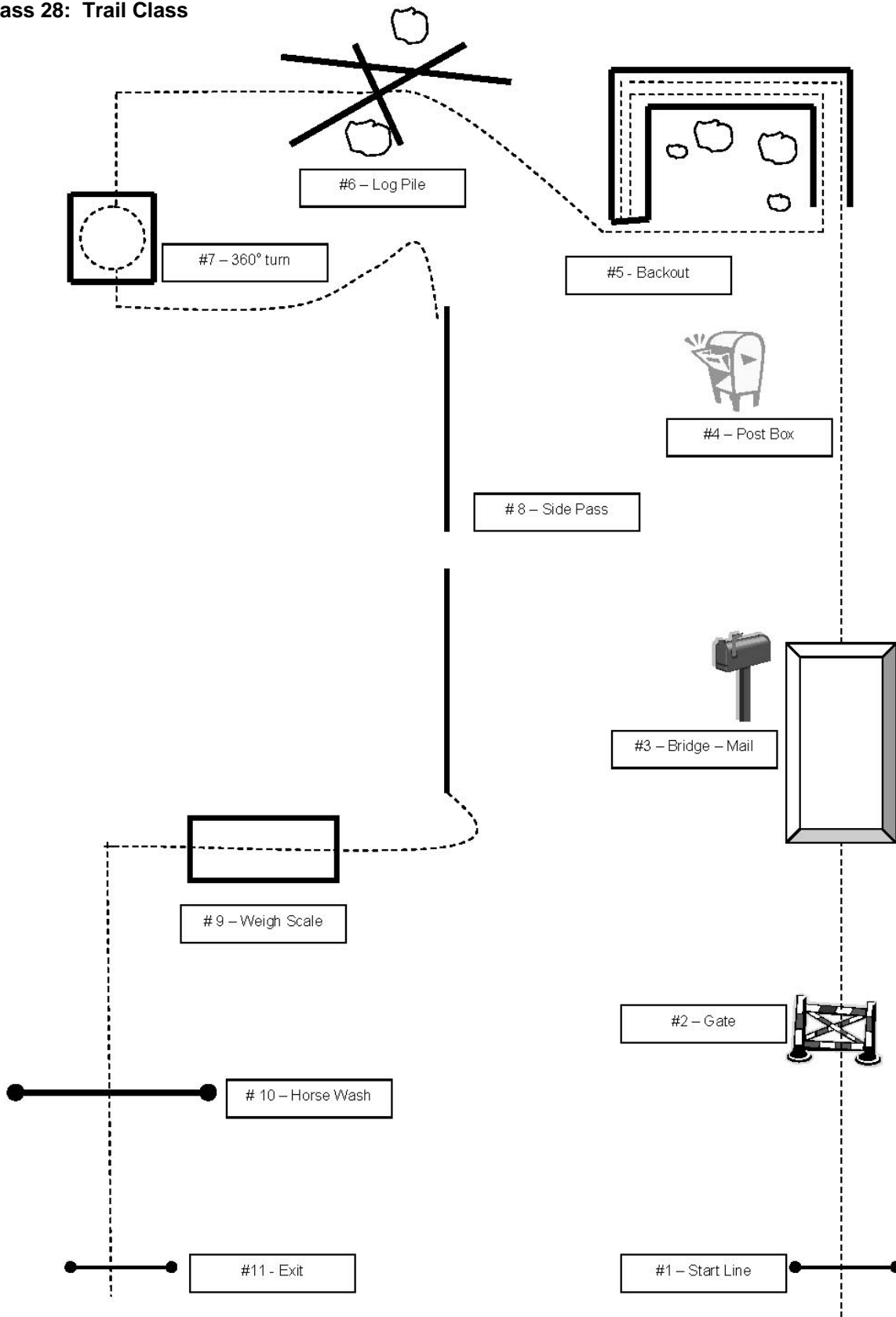
CLASS 28: TRAIL CLASS
52 POINTS AVAILABLE - 4 MINUTE TIME LIMIT

Horse/Rider combination to be judged. Choose obstacles but no obstacles may be repeated until all other obstacles are completed. 4 points may be awarded for maneuver executed as described. 3 points, 2 points or 1 point may also be awarded. 0 points for did not or could not execute. Judge may subtract 1 point if it is felt the maneuver should not have been tried and subtract 2 points if the rider endangers themselves, the horse or other participants. Horse is to be ridden in gait between obstacles. Up to 4 points to be awarded for gait.

1. **START** – After being acknowledged by the Judge , pass between the start poles to start timer
2. **GATE** – Leaving the area you go through the gate. You must open it and close it to keep the other horses in. Add 4 points for completing without letting go of the gate
3. **BRIDGE & MAILBOX** (4 points each) - After you go through the gate you cross a bridge to get to the trail. Partway across the bridge you pick up the mail. Take one envelope out of the mailbox and close the door, then proceed across the bridge.
4. **POSTBOX** – You realize that the letter you have is not for you so you must put it into the Postbox.
5. **BACK OUT** – You go down a narrow path and make 2 sharp turns to the right only to discover that the trail is blocked. You go up to the block to check it but since it can't be moved, you must back out and continue by a different way
6. **LOG PILE** – This other way has downed logs across it. You will walk through the fallen logs.
7. **360 degree TURN** – You will come to a square made of logs. Go into the square and pivot 360 degrees. You may turn clockwise or counterclockwise pivoting off the Haunches or the Forehand. All feet must stay inside the logs.
8. **SIDEPASS** – Sidepass along the poles keeping the front feet on one side of the pole and the hind feet on the other You may sidepass to either right or left over the first pole and then you must sidepass to the other side over the second pole
9. **WEIGH SCALE** – You will have to stand with all 4 feet on the "SCALE" for 5 seconds.
10. **HORSE WASH** – Since you are at the end of your ride you will want to wash your horse. Go through the plastic door and through the wash. + 4 points for stopping in the doorway with the plastic touching the horse's neck for 5 seconds.
