RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

APPROVAL AND POINTS

The Wild West Classic is an event combining two separate Regional Championship shows. The PHCBC Regional Championship Show is sponsored by the Peruvian Horse Club of BC and the Wild Rose Regional Championship Show is sponsored by the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta. Each show is approved by the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada and will receive **DOUBLE POINTS** towards PHAC awards.

MEMBERSHIP AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

Non-Members of the PHAC are eligible to participate in this event and will not be charged any additional fees. Horses registered or pending with the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada are eligible to be shown. Horses owned by residents of Canada **MUST** be registered or pending with the PHAC. Horses owned by residents of other countries are eligible to be shown provided they are registered or pending with AAOBPPH, PPHRNA or NAPHA. Owners in arrears with PHCBC, PHCA, PHAC or NAPHA will not be allowed to show until arrears are cleared.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The shows are run under PHAC show rules and in any case where this Premium List appears to be in conflict with those rules, the PHAC Rules shall take precedence. Everything possible is being done to conduct this show on the highest possible level for the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators. The best adjudicating officials to be found have been selected and they will place awards on the horses as they see them presented in the ring, without regard to previous records and performances. The PHCBC and PHCA are most desirous of fair treatment for all exhibitors and in return ask for cooperation of all helping to make this show a successful and enjoyable event. Every person who participates in this show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the rules and regulations of:

1. The PHAC By-Laws
2. The PHAC Book of Peruvian Horse Showing 2011
3. The Peruvian Horse Breed Standard and PHAC Code of Ethics

Copies of the above named Rules and Regulations can be obtained at a cost of \$ 5.00 by writing to: The Peruvian Horse Association of Canada, Lyalta, Alberta, T0J 1Y0 or at no cost from the PHAC website (www.phac.ca).

All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class descriptions, descriptions of gear and attire, conduct and ethics, and conditions for this show are described in the above named publications. **ALL EXHIBITORS, HANDLERS AND RIDERS** and other persons participating in the show are responsible for a thorough knowledge of **ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS**.

Displays of poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Anyone with a complaint or protest must file at the show office and arrange for an appointment with the official Show Steward.

RESPONSIBILITY

All entries will be accepted with the understanding that the PHCBC, PHCA, PHAC, members of the show committee and Claresholm Agriplex will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that in any way may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Management but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs, that may arise out of any injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of himself or any other person in charge of any such horse. PLEASE ensure that you have sufficient personal insurance coverage to supplement the coverage provided by the show.

SUBSTITUTION OF JUDGES AND OTHER OFFICIALS

In the event that the judge (or other official designated herein) is unable to perform his/her duties due to circumstances beyond his/her control or for any other reason, the Peruvian Horse Club of BC and/or the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta reserve the right to substitute another approved judge (or other official) in his/her place.

JUDGE'S AUTHORITY

The judge shall have the authority to place any horse in whatever position in a class he/she thinks the merit of the horse justifies. The Judge shall award first, second or third place, etc., according to merit, but shall award places starting with first and continuing in order in each

class. This applies whether there are one or more entries in a class. If there are more horses of merit in a class than there are prizes offered in that class, the Judge has the right to award honorable mentions. The Judge has the right to make favorable comments over the public address system about the horses shown before him/her, but shall make no negative comments.

DRUGS & FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES

Please be advised that mandatory random drug screening MAY be enforced at this show. There will be a \$5.00 fee to cover the cost of testing (included in ALL-IN-ONE fee). If a horse is randomly chosen, it is escorted to separate area where it must be kept until successful collection of a sample of blood or urine. Please also note:

- a) The exhibitor or his agent is to advise the Show Manager or Secretary in writing of all drugs administered in any fashion within (seventy-two) 72 hours prior to or during the show. This information is to be made available for inspection by anyone interested.
- b) No horse shall be eligible for competition in any class if it has been administered a forbidden substance, i.e. any stimulant, depressant, tranquilizer or local anesthetic which might affect the performance, temperament or courage of the horse. Also prohibited are any drugs which might mask or screen the presence of forbidden substances. Any horse entered in an approved show is subject to examination by the official show veterinarian. Such examinations may include physical, saliva, urine and blood. Refusal to submit a horse for examination and to cooperate with the official show veterinarian and technicians constitutes a violation and subjects the responsible person to penalties.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Horses from the United States will need a CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS report (Coggins test good for 6 months) and an INTERNATIONAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE endorsed by a Federal Veterinarian, showing examination within the 30 days prior to entering Canada. This paperwork can take as long as three weeks so please plan ahead. For further information contact the Canadian Veterinarian at Canada Customs at the border crossing of your choice. Please check for a current schedule to cross without an appointment or to set an appointment.

STALLIONS

For the purposes of showing, stallions 4 and over will be required to have two descended testicles. The only exception being those registered as breeding stallions with the PHAC, AAOBPPH, PPHRNA or NAPHA with one descended testicle for which veterinary certification can be provided showing that the missing testicle was lost due to non-hereditary causes such as illness or injury.

PRUEBA FUNCIONAL

This is **mandatory** for all horses which qualify for a Championship in the breeding, luxury, performance, pleasure and gait divisions (under saddle) in this show. **It will consist of three (3) miles more or less, which must be covered in thirty (30) minutes or less.** The horses must work in gait and must wear a saddle and bridle of any style. The Prueba Funcional is not to be used as a means of disqualifying horses in and of itself. Provided the horse completes the Prueba in the allotted time, the horse will be eligible to enter the championship class where eliminations for unsoundness will take place in the usual manner. The Prueba Funcional will be held on Sunday, July 17th at 7:30 am in the Arena. A list of qualifying horses that must complete the Prueba will be posted outside the show office. If your horse qualifies, please report 15 minutes prior to your allotted time.

PLEASE NOTE: FOR DOUBLE REGIONAL SHOWS ONLY - Any bit horse which has qualified for a championship class but has completed four (4) saddle classes for that show will be exempt from the Prueba. As per BOD ruling, returning Champions completing any 4 saddles classes for either club show, will fulfil the 4 saddle class rule.

WARM UP RING

An outside warm up ring will be available prior to and during the show.

STABLING FACILITIES

3 nights are included in "All in One" entry fee including bedding and cleanout. Stall fees for 3 nights will be \$60 for all non-showing or sales horses. Tack rooms are \$60 for 3 nights. Horses must be placed in assigned stalls and **no changes will be permitted except with the consent of the barn manager**. Each animal must have a separate stall (except broodmares with suckling foals). Stalls will be ready for use Thursday, July 14th at noon and must be vacated by Sunday, July 17th at 8:00 PM (unless additional nights have been paid for). Exhibitors who require additional nights either before or after the show should note on their entry forms and/or contact the barn manager Gene Rosia at 403-466-7608 or rosia@platinum.ca. Fees for extra days will be \$15/day.

SECURITY

There will be no security. The Show Committee recommends that all vehicles, trailers and tack rooms are locked and personal items in the camping area are secured at all times.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A PHOTOCOPY OF THE FRONT AND BACK OF THE HORSE'S REGISTRATION CERTIFICATION. IN THE CASE OF A "PENDING REGISTRATION", INCLUDE A COPY OF THE APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION. EVERY ENTRY FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY THE OWNER OR HIS AUTHORIZED AGENT. IF SIGNED BY AN AGENT, INCLUDE A COPY OF THE AUTHORIZATION.

SHOW ENTRIES MUST BE PAID IN FULL PRIOR TO ENTERING CLASSES. FOR ACCOUNTING PURPOSES, EXHIBITORS MAY NOT LEAVE "BLANK CHEQUES" AT THE SHOW OFFICE OR REQUEST STAKES/PURSE WINNINGS BE DEDUCTED FROM ENTRY FEES.

POST ENTRIES

There will be a \$20.00 post entry fee at this show; however, to help our show secretary, all exhibitors are encouraged to send their entry forms and fees no later than July 1st, 2011. The Show Office will open Thursday, July 14th at 6:00 pm, and 1 hour before the start of

each session, closing 15 minutes before classes start to allow for additions to classes and changes. Please ensure all additions are made before this Time even if you are not sure you are going to enter a class, add in that class. Scratches will be taken at the gate by the gate steward.

CONCESSION

There will be a concession offered.

MEET THE JUDGES – THURSDAY JULY 14th AT 8:00 PM

The judges will be introduced to the exhibitors at a meeting on Thursday, July 14th at 8:00 pm in the Concession area of the Arena.

GATE RULE

The 3-minute gate rule will be strictly adhered to. Call for classes will be made well in advance, so be at the holding area and **CHECKED IN WITH THE RING ADMISSION STEWARD** before your class is going in the door. When a tack or attire change is required and an entry cannot make the 3-minute ruling, a request for additional time may be approved by the Show Manager or in his absence, the Ring Admission Steward, Show Secretary, or the Show Announcer prior to the start of judging.

NO ENTRY WILL BE PERMITTED INTO THE RING AFTER THE GATE HAS BEEN CLOSED.

LARGER CLASSES

Larger classes may be divided at the discretion of the Ring Master.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded for first through fifth place in every class. Champions of Champions, Best Gait and Best Bozal will receive large traditional neck ribbons. Large, distinctive ribbons will be awarded to Champions and Reserve Champions. Trophies will be awarded to Champions, Champion of Champions, Best Gait, Best Bozal and High Point Winners.

PRIMERISO (NOVICE) DIVISION – Please note rule change effective January 1, 2007.

As of January 1, 2007, a Novice will be defined as a person who on January 1st of the current year, has not won **five first place awards** in classes at shows approved by the PHAC, NAPHA, PPHRNA, or AAOBPPH. (I.E. if a person starts the year as a novice, they will be eligible to

show as a novice for the entire calendar year even if they pass the "five-firsts" milestone during the year.) **Please read PHAC Show Rules Rule IX, Part II, Section 6A for the complete rules in this division.** Exhibitors with shod horses will be permitted to participate in this division but cannot participate in any other classes except the Costume Class. A High Point Primeriso award will be presented to the exhibitor that has accumulated the most points in the qualifying classes at this show. . Points will be awarded 1 – 6 (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place, 5 for 2nd place, 4 for 3rd place, 3 for 4th place and 2 for 5th place).

JUNIOR CLASSES

Please note: Effective January 1, 2007, helmets are mandatory for Junior riders in the 12 and under age category. The Junior Division will be split in two age groups where possible (12 years of age & under and 13 years of age & over). At the discretion of the Show Committee, the junior classes may be run simultaneously, however judging and ribbon presentation will remain separated.

HIGH POINT HORSE OF SHOW AWARD

The entry with the highest number of points based on the top five placings in their best classes will be the High Point Horse of Show. Point will be awarded 1 – 6 (1 for participation, 6 for 1st place). Classes which qualify for High Point Horse of Show points are: 6, 8, 9, 26, 27, 33, 39, & 50.

JUDGING PROCEDURE: The horses will be judged by both Judges, however the Judges will NOT CONFER; except in the event of dismissing a horse, the judges must confer and be unanimous. Any requests requiring the consent of the other Judge (such as for a short recess) shall be made through the Ring Steward, who will advise the other Judge and the Announcer.

A. REGULAR CLASSES: A Champion of Champions or Laureado horse will not appear on the Judge's card, for that division, for a club in which it is a past Champion of Champions or Laureado.

B. CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: Horses that qualify in a regular class will be judged in the show in which it qualified.

C. CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CLASSES: Past champions may go directly into the Champion of Champions classes for which they are qualified, along with the champions of the current year. The past National Champions of Champions will also be allowed to enter directly: NAPHA, PPHRNA, AAOBPPH, and PHAC. A Laureado horse will not appear on Judge's card, for that division, for the show in which it is Laureado.

SPECIAL CLASS RULES

CLASS 6 VINTAGE – This is open to all horses (bit or bozal) ridden by those who are 59 Yrs of age or older by the date of the show. Will be judged as a pleasure class but open to amateurs and professionals.

CLASS 7 GELDING STAKES - Entry Fee - \$100 (\$50/show). To be judged as per Luxury Gelding rules and is open only to geldings born in North America. Prize money will be awarded from a percentage of the proceeds from entries and donations, to be divided as follows: 1st - 40%; 2nd - 25%; 3rd - 20%; 4th - 10%; 5th - 5%.

CLASS 8 BOZAL PERFORMANCE - Open to all bozal horses 3 & 4 years of age. Horses will be required to negotiate a pattern. See illustration in premium list.

CLASS 13 SIMON SAYS – Open to bit or bozal horses. Rider will be asked to perform (or not) a series of commands. Turn on your listening skills. Participants will be eliminated for not following instructions.

CLASS 26 OPEN REINING TO MUSIC - Open to horses in bit, amateur or professional rider. The horse and rider must perform an individual routine limited to no longer than 3 minutes. Please ensure you bring your own music. A CD player will be supplied.

CLASS 33 PERFORMANCE PAIRS - Open to horses in bit or bozal, amateur or professional rider. Judged on similarity of attire and performance of both horses performing as one.

CLASS 46 JACK & JILL BENNY – This is open to all horses (bit or bozal) ridden by those who are 39 Yrs of age or older by the date of the show. Will be judged as a pleasure class but open to amateurs and professionals.

CLASS 51 CHAMPAGNE STAKES – Open to bit or bozal horses. Entry fee of \$10.00 and winner takes all!

PRIZE MONEY WILL BE AWARDED IN SOME MYSTERY CLASSES FOR EACH SHOW.

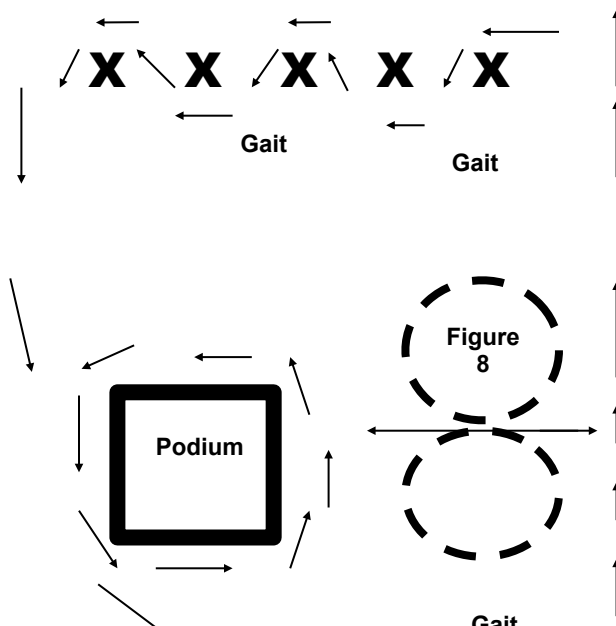
****** NEW THIS YEAR****
Introducing Pizzaro's Pot – A Graduation Award**

This award is being introduced by the Peruvian Horse Club of Alberta as an incentive to promote the young horse shown in bozal the first year and then in the bit in the second consecutive year. It is open to Stallions, Mares, and Geldings and is based on the total number of points won over the two years. It is an incentive promoted by the PHCA only, and the points used will only come from competing at the same PHCA Regional Show for 2 years in a row. The qualifying classes will be Breeding/Luxury, Gait and Open Performance for the bit horse as well as all the bozal classes for the bozal horses. Points won in the first year will be carried over to the following year and at the end of the second show, the points from the two years will be tallied up and the horse with the most points will be declared the winner. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st – 6 points, 2nd – 5, 3rd – 4, 4th – 3points, 5th – 2 and 1 point for participating. Eg: If you are showing in Mares Bozal and there are 6 mares in the class but you place 3rd and the horses that placed 1st and 2nd are not entered into the incentive program; you will awarded 6 points for being the highest placing horse in the program. If all the horses are entered into the program, then you will received the points for your 3rd placing. These points will then be carried over to the next year, added into that current year's points and the horses with the highest number of points will WIN PIZARRO'S POT. In the event of a tie, the Open Performance class will be the tie-breaker. In the event of a second tie, the total number of Championships will be tallied.

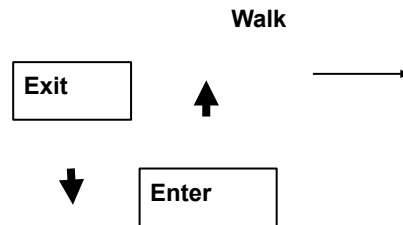
Horses entered into this graduation program must be registered with the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada. If the horse is sold after the first year, it is still eligible for the award if the new owner enters and pays the fee for the 2nd year. The points are for the horse only; not the horse/rider combination or for the owners. These points are totally independent of the PHAC members' high point awards.

Entry Fee: \$75/year with a pay out of 55% to the winning horse, 25% to the second place horse and 20% to the PHCA after the second consecutive year.

1. Enter arena
2. Halt and salute the Judge
3. Turn Right, walk to rail
4. Continue on the rail in gait to midpoint of arena
5. Perform two (2) large figure 8's in gait
6. Stop in center of last figure 8 and stand quietly for 10 seconds, facing stands
7. Back 3 to 5 steps. Walk forward to rail
8. Proceed to cones plants in gait and serpentine through staying in gait
10. Circle Judge's podium in gait
11. Gait back to exit. Halt and Salute judge and proceed out of Arena
